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The Radical Peculiar Personality

The following was drawn from the book, *The GRAND MEDICINE Personality Iridology Student Handbook* (based on the book, *IRIS-2, Personality Iridology*, by Leonard Mehlmauer, ND). This is an overview of one of several types of iris structures that define various corresponding Personality types. Question: (1) How do we see the *Shaker-Flower* Structure in the irises, and (2) how do we define the personality that goes with it?

Answer: (1) The Shaker-Flower Structure (which corresponds to the Radical-Peculiar Personality) appears in the irises as a varied structural base: look for more Flowers (a minimum total of six rounded openings) than Jewels (a minimum total of three pigment spots). In this illustration, notice the number of openings (Flowers) is somewhat more in number than the pigment spots (Jewels). The Flowerness (Peculiar Personality qualities) therefore tends to dominate. The combination of Flowers and Jewels brings out the Radical Personality quality. The more physical characteristics (Vital Personality qualities), which are not dominant in this case, are seen in the periphery of this iris.



Description: (2) The Radical Peculiar person has a tendency to be emotional, expressive, and radical (wanting to always go to the root of things—no nonsense, “Let’s not waste time, let’s get to the bottom of this, to the root of matters”). They are often gifted with visionary passion. Their gestures are dynamic and their posture is animated. Their perspective is “you” and “they” (the 2nd and the 4th person). They tend to be inspirational, creative, compassionate, and skilled at facilitating group dynamics. Important lessons for them include physical control, right use of power, and focusing attention.

They tend to learn subconsciously via bodily experience and listening. They communicate consciously via synergistic and animated activities, both verbal and visual. In family relationships they tend to be closer to their father and brother(s), and to have problems with their mother and sister(s). In mate relationships, they are usually best suited to the Stream-Jewel/Vital-Solid.

In activities and disposition, they tend to be social, entertaining and playful. Their energy patterns and direction tend to movement and release. Radical-Peculiar types tend to sleep on their right side, with their partner on their left. They tend to lack method and to be compulsive. In their true form, they tend to be exhilarating. They tend to have excellent ideas on advancing society and—unlike Radical Solids—have more ability to make them happen...provided they have the support of good people around them to keep them directed.

Pathology Tendencies: On the physical level, Radical-Peculiar types tend to have problems with their knees, heart and circulatory system (high BP is fairly common), kidneys, endocrine organs, and nutritive system.

Rx: The BIG 7 + right use of the LQF's (low quality foods and substances), eating slowly and chewing well, daily exercise and sticking with a schedule, checking with your same-sex group before going off in some bizarre direction with your life; Astragalus, RMVJ (raw mixed veggie juice), red raspberry leaf tea, cayenne, Hawthorne berry, colloidal minerals, Vitamins C, E, & B complex, Rejuvelac, and real meditation on the Divine.

Important note: It is to be strictly understood in this illustration that we are using one iris for our example of each Structure only for illustration purposes. When actually looking to determine Structure, giving a label to Structure, or otherwise differentiating Structure by observing live irises or even images, we must see both irises. And a note of reminder: physical inheritance is mostly genetics and doesn't change much; Personality characteristics are certainly more plastic and can possibly change quite a bit.
