

Gardening Uses

Fertilizer: 2-3 drops per quart of water, once a week on plants.

Don't overdo it!

Green Lawns: Put 2 Tbsp. in a hose sprayer and fill with water. This will make 2 gallons of spray.

House Plants: A few drops in water to use to wipe down leaves.

Rose Bushes: Use 1 tsp. to a gallon of water. Spraying rose bushes will protect them from red spider and other diseases and will help make bushes flourish.

Soil Conditioner: Helps water permeate the soil better. For bare soil use 2 quarts per 40 gallons of water, when spraying on plants use 1 quart per 40 gallons. For smaller areas (gardens, etc.) use 2 oz. per gallon on bare soil and 1 oz. per gallon on plants.



Other Uses

Camping Pans: Apply undiluted on the bottom of pots and pans before cooking makes them easy to clean. Works in cold or salt water.

Golfers: 1 tsp. in a pint of water for golf clubs and golf balls. Also for golf gloves.

Humidifiers: 3-4 drops in water help prevent rust and scum; eliminates mineral.

Leather: Cleans leather better than saddle soap. Put 2 drops on damp sponge. Clean and wipe dry.

Paint Brushes: Work straight into brush, wash with water. Non-flammable.

Remove Skunk Smell: 2 Tbsp. per gallon of water. Even more effective when used with Nature's Fresh.

Silver Polish: Rub on with cloth, rinse with water.

Vinyl: 1/2 tsp. in a 16 oz. spray bottle works on all vinyl surfaces including automobiles.

Windows and Screens: 1 tsp. to 2 gallons of water for spraying.

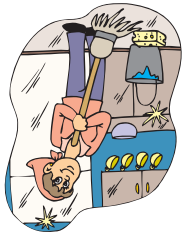

Household Uses



Appliances and Bathroom Fixtures: 1/2 teaspoon in pint of water. Leaves refrigerator odor-free.

Aquariums: Add 1 teaspoon in quart of water to clean coral, rocks, entire aquarium. Rinse thoroughly.

Clothes Dryer: Use large spray bottle with cleaner solution (1/2 tsp. to 16 oz. water) to eliminate static.

Crisping Lettuce: Use 2 or 3 drops in bowl of water.

Diapers: 1/2 teaspoon in pail of water.

Dishes: 1-2 teaspoons in the dishpan. For dirty pans fill pan with hot water, add 1/2 teaspoon, let stand to loosen stuck particles

Dusting: 1/2 teaspoon to a quart of warm water.

Squeeze solution out of sponge to almost dry or spray solution on clean cloth and wipe. Leaves bright, non-magnetic surface that will not attract dust.

Electric Coffee maker: Put 1/2 teaspoon in pot of

Fine Fabrics: To clean woolens, silks, nylons and fine

fabrics add 1 teaspoon to basin of water. For spots, apply a drop or two directly on the spot and press in with thumb; then immerse in basin solution, allow to stand a few minutes. Rinse thoroughly and dry according to label directions.

Floors: 1/2 teaspoon to gallon of cool water. This concentration will not remove polish. Wring mop dry and wipe up spots and dirt, leaving floor shine.

Fruits and Vegetables: Add 1/2 teaspoon to large bowl or dishpan of water. (For even better results add 1/2 teaspoon of Nature's Fresh, too.) Allow fruits



minutes to remove pesticides, dirt and other chemicals. Rinse.

Frying Vats: Use 1 cup to 3 gallons of water. Boil for 5

minutes, stirring constantly. Dissipates stubborn crusts without damages to vats.

General Cleaning: 1 teaspoon in quart of water for woodwork, walls, ceilings.

Glass, Windows, Mirrors: 1 drop in 4 oz. spray bottle of water. Glass will smear if more than recommended amount is used.

Gum (to remove): Use full strength.

Ironing: Adding 1 or 2 drops to the water in a steam iron keeps jet and interior clean and free of mineral deposits; no need to buy distilled water. Iron on a rag the first time—it will clean out any old deposits.



Kitchen Floors: 1/2 teaspoon to quart of warm water.

Laundry: 1-2 Tablespoons per load.

Plumbing: Will keep drains open and pipes clean when used regularly. It emulsifies grease.

Sharpening Knives: Put a few drops on a whetstone for sharpening knives; keep moist and add more as needed. Doesn't clog stone and stone will be free of residue when rinsed.

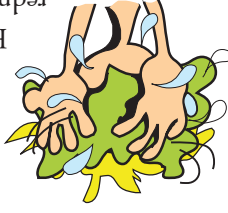
Spot Remover: Apply Sunshine Concentrate and Nature's Fresh directly to spot and use toothbrush to rub in, then wipe off with damp cloth or rinse. Good for coffee, lipstick, ink, grass, grease.

Wallpaper Removal: 2 tablespoons to a pail of hot water; apply with swab or mop and lift off. Use a solution of 1 tablespoon per gallon of water to clean off the residue.

Personal Care

Bathing: 2 tsp. to tub of water. Run water full force for bubbles.

Burns & Cuts: Rub directly on. Helps healing, reduces pain and redness, prevents blistering.



Eye-glass Cleaner: 1 drop to 4 oz. water. Spray on, wipe off.

Hand Soap: Put a few drops in the palm. Rub

thoroughly over both hands. Add a little water, continue with washing. Removes tobacco stains, grease, onion or garlic odors.

Insect Bites: Rub full strength directly on bites to relieve itching.

Insect Repellent: Apply full strength (or with equal parts water) to exposed areas.

Painting And Dying: Apply full strength to hands and face before painting or dyeing and allow to dry. Paint or dye will wash off easily afterwards. This is called the "invisible glove."

Shampoo: 1 teaspoon to 1 cup water.

Shaving: Apply full strength to face and add water to make slight lather. Razor blades last longer. Lets you see where you're shaving.

Shoe Cleaner: 2 drops on a wet cloth. Will not remove finish. Shine with dry cloth.

Automotive Uses

Car Washing: Use 1 Tbsp. in gallon of water. Easy removal of bugs and road grime. Wipe windshield, windows, and chrome after rinsing. Remainder of car dries without spots or streaks.

Battery Terminals: 1/2 tsp. in pint of water. Spray on, let soak for 2 minutes, then clean with a wire brush.

Engines: Use 1/2 oz. to one gallon water to clean engine. Will not affect paint, gaskets, or insulating material. Best results can be achieved when the engine is hot, for fastest drying of the ignition system.

Tires: Great for cleaning white walls. Can also spray on rims to make tires go on easier.

Windshield Washing: Add 5-6 drops to quart of water and fill windshield washing jar. Add anti-freeze solution in winter.
